We're Welding!

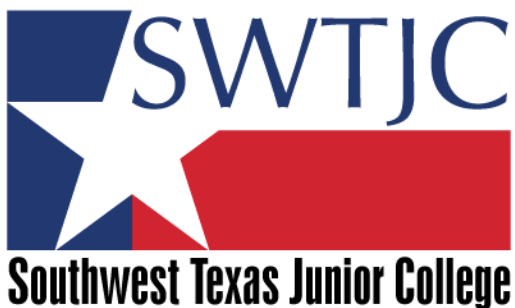

Arc into the Future Scholarship

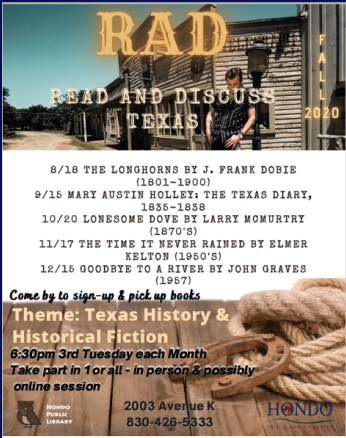
