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Keeping Gods Country Working Overview

- ▶ In response to COVID-19 (Coronavirus), the Hondo City Staff researched different opportunities to assist businesses during the time of need. Putting together “Keeping God’s Country Working Grant Program(s)” to assist businesses negatively affected by the pandemic.
- ▶ Keeping God’s Country Working Grant Program is a local economic development program authorized under Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code to help reduce the resulting economic strain on local businesses. On March 19, 2020, the Hondo City Council declared a local state of disaster. As a result, the pandemic caused closures and limitations on local businesses in Hondo.

Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program

- ▶ To keep businesses running through a time of social distancing, the Task Force developed this stimulus program to assist small Hondo businesses that are independently owned and operated With a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 25 employees.
- ▶ Eligible industries may include retail (storefront), food and beverage; personal care (barber shop, nail salons, spas, etc.), automobile maintenance, education training, health/wellness, art galleries and small manufacturing businesses. *National chains, financial institutions, RV parks, apartment complexes, home-based businesses, permanently closed businesses, and non-profit organizations are not eligible for the grant. Grants will NOT exceed \$10,000.00*
- ▶ Eligibility & Qualifications
 - ▶ Applicants employing between 1 - 4 employees are eligible for grants up to \$2,000.00, 5 - 10 employees are eligible for grants up to \$5,000.00. Applicants employing between 11 - 25 employees are eligible for grants up to \$10,000.00.

Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program

- ▶ Small businesses wishing to apply for the grant must meet the following criteria:
 - ▶ Physical and publicly accessible location within the City of Hondo city limits (no home-based businesses).
 - ▶ Experienced or projected to experience a decline in revenue and/or employment starting April 1, 2020 and ending at which time the government has allowed citizens to return to normal activity.
 - ▶ In good standing with the City of Hondo regarding licensing and permits.
 - ▶ Must be registered with the Texas Comptroller's Office as a sales tax revenue generating business for the City of Hondo.
 - ▶ Engaged in activities that are legal under city and state law.

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Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program

- ▶ Eligible expenses allowed under the grant program include:
 - ▶ Rent/Mortgage
 - ▶ Employee support (salaries, insurance, paid leave, etc.)
 - ▶ Utilities (electricity, phone/internet, etc.)
 - ▶ Purchase of supplies to offer alternative business access (curbside pickup, delivery, shipping)
 - ▶ Purchase of COVID-19 supplies for business/customer protection/cleaning
 - ▶ Additional expenses as a result of increased cost from suppliers or alternate suppliers
 - ▶ Other business needs as approved by the Small Business Task Force

Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing Grant

- ▶ The Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing grant is being implemented to assist small businesses during a time of social distancing. Tourism-related businesses are encouraged to promote their business to existing customers and attract new customers outside of Hondo. If approved, a qualifying small business located within the Hondo city limits, can be reimbursed for 100% of online marketing costs, up to \$50 per month, for a maximum of two months. The maximum funding for this program is \$5,000.
- ▶ The Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing Grant is available under the Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program. This Grant will aid tourism-related local businesses in their marketing efforts during the COVID-19 disaster.
- ▶ Applications for this marketing program will be accepted through August 2020. The co-marketing fund is limited and is administered on a first-come, first-served basis. Additionally, funds are limited to a two-month maximum, but may be extended if deemed necessary by the City Manager or their designee. Only qualifying tourism-related businesses may apply for reimbursement.



Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing Grant

▶ Guidelines:

- ▶ Business must be a registered business located within Hondo City limits. Businesses located in the ETJ do not qualify.
- ▶ Business must do their best to apply for the grant prior to launching the advertisement or fill out the application as soon as possible to know if they are eligible for reimbursement before spending advertising dollars.
- ▶ Businesses must be privately owned and must be in a tourism-service related industry to include retail, food, beverage, etc.
- ▶ Advertisements must adhere to and support proper social distancing guidelines as adopted by the City of Hondo, i.e. promotion of website, free shipping, etc.
- ▶ Each business is eligible for 100% reimbursement for a maximum of \$50 per month for a maximum of two months for their initiative during the COVID-19 emergency.
- ▶ Qualifying advertisements are limited to social media, web and online marketing efforts.

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Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing Grant

▶ Guidelines:

- ▶ Website creation is a qualifying expense and can be reimbursed up to the maximum amount of \$100 at the time of the expense.
- ▶ Qualifying advertisements may target potential customers in Hondo but must primarily target potential customers from outside of Hondo City Limits.
- ▶ Months do not need to be consecutive for purposes of the grant but only a maximum of two months will be approved per qualifying business.
- ▶ Applications will be reviewed at the time they are submitted.
- ▶ Qualifying advertisements can be combined to equal the maximum grant allowed per month (i.e. Combining Facebook ads and Google Ads to equal \$50 per month).

Hondo Emergency Co-Marketing Grant

▶ Guidelines:

- ▶ Advertising must promote tourism and meet the Texas Hotel Occupancy Tax Code requirements:
 - ▶ The expenditure must directly enhance and promote tourism and the convention and hotel industry
 - ▶ Promote tourism in the City of Hondo
- ▶ Receipts must be turned in by August 31, 2020 to receive reimbursement. If the applicant fails to turn in receipts for an approved advertisement by this date, the application will expire and the applicant will no longer be able to collect on the reimbursement.

Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Payment Deferral + Forgiveness Program

- ▶ The City of Hondo has developed a Hotel Occupancy Tax Payment Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program to assist hotels within the City of Hondo during the COVID-19 pandemic. This program will be funded through the City of Hondo. The program provides limited financial assistance through the deferral and forgiveness of hotel occupancy tax payments to hotels severely impacted as a result of the 'Stay at Home, Work Safe' Order implemented by Medina County and the City of Hondo to lessen the impact of COVID-19.
- ▶ Look to defer hotel occupancy tax payments for April 2020 and May 2020 for 60 days with an effort to support all hotels in good-standing with the City of Hondo Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund. All hotels applying for deferral to submit a written employee retention plan to receive the 60-day deferral.
- ▶ The Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program provides a 60-day deferral of hotel occupancy tax payments for April 20, 2020 and May 20, 2020, with an additional offering of forgiving up to \$1,000.00 per month for a total of no more than three (3) months of forgiven occupancy tax payments. This program has an aggregate of \$9,000.00 available for hotel occupancy tax forgiveness.

Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Payment Deferral + Forgiveness Program

▶ Eligibility and Qualifications:

- ▶ To keep hotels running through a time of social distancing, the City of Hondo has developed a deferral and forgiveness program that can assist hotels that 1) pay hotel occupancy tax to the City of Hondo and 2) are in good-standing on HOT payments. Hotels wishing to apply for the program must meet the following criteria:
 - ▶ Prior to submitting the application, please check that your hotel meets all of the following qualifications:
 - ▶ Collects hotel occupancy tax for the City of Hondo
 - ▶ Experienced or projected to experience a decline in revenue between March 1, 2020 and May 31, 2020 as a result of COVID-19 pandemic.
 - ▶ Experienced or projected to experience a decline in employment as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
 - ▶ In good standing with the City of Hondo with regard to licensing and finance, including being current on sales and use tax payments.
 - ▶ Engaged in activities that are legal under city and state law.
 - ▶ Meet program technical requirements including ability to provide financial statements to support request.

In response to COVID-19 (Coronavirus), the Hondo City Council authorized the Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program to assist businesses negatively affected by the pandemic. Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program is a local economic development program authorized under Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code to help reduce the resulting economic strain on local businesses. On March 19, 2020, the Hondo City Council declared a local state of disaster. As a result, the pandemic caused closures and limitations on local businesses in Hondo. The Council tasked staff and Economic Development Corporation to research ways to assist businesses during the time of need.

The Task Force consists of:

Hondo City Mayor, James W. Danner, Sr, Hondo City Council Member John Mc Anelly; City Manager of the City of Hondo Kim Davis; Economic Development Corporation Board President Bobby Ainsley; Hondo Economic Development Corporation Executive Director Genevieve Flores; Hondo Area Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Heather Curtsinger; Hondo Independent School District Assistant Superintendent Rosemary Mares; Medina County Economic Development Director Stephanie Blanks; and City Attorney for the City of Hondo Frank Garza. Unlike the other members of the Task Force, Frank Garza reviews applications for legal compliance only.

Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program

On April 15, 2020 members of the Hondo Economic Development Corporation (Hondo EDC) approved an Agreement for Funding of the Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program. On April 16, 2020 the Hondo City Council affirmed the committed funds to this program. The total contributions by the City of Hondo Economic Development Corporation amount to \$300,000.

Eligibility & Qualifications

To keep businesses running through a time of social distancing, the Task Force developed this stimulus program to assist small Hondo businesses that are independently owned and operated with a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 25 employees. Eligible industries may include retail (storefront), food and beverage; personal care (barber shop, nail salons, spas, etc.), automobile maintenance, education training, health/wellness, art galleries and small manufacturing businesses. National chains, financial institutions, RV parks, apartment complexes, home-based businesses, permanently closed businesses, and non-profit organizations are not eligible for the grant. Applicants employing between 1 – 4 employees are eligible for up to \$2,000.00. 5 – 10 employees are eligible for grants up to \$5,000.00. Applicants employing between 11 – 25 employees are eligible for grants up to \$10,000.00.

Tourism-related businesses are encouraged to promote their business to existing customers and attract new customers outside of Hondo.

Eligible expenses allowed under the grant program include:

If approved, a qualifying small business located within the Hondo city limits, can be reimbursed for 100% of online marketing costs, up to \$50 per month, for a maximum of two months. Maximum amount of funds committed to this program is \$5,000.00.

Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Payment Deferral + Forgiveness Program

The Hondo City Council took measures at the April 16, 2020 City Council meeting to defer hotel occupancy tax payments for April 20, 2020 and May 20, 2020 for 60 days with an effort to support all hotels in good-standing with the City of Hondo Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund. The City Council required all hotels applying for deferral to submit a written employee retention plan to receive the 60-day deferral. The Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program provides a 60-day deferral of hotel occupancy tax payments for April 20, 2020 and May 20, 2020, with an additional offering of forgiving up to \$1,000.00 per month for a total of no more than three (3) months of forgiven occupancy tax payments. This program has an aggregate of \$9,000.00 available for hotel occupancy tax forgiveness.

Eligibility & Qualifications

Only hotels that 1) pay hotel occupancy tax to the City of Hondo and 2) are in good-standing on HOT payments qualify for the deferral + forgiveness program.



Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program Application

Overview:

The City of Hondo and the Hondo Economic Development Corporation ("Hondo EDC"), have developed Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program to assist small businesses within the City of Hondo during the COVID-19 pandemic. The program provides limited financial assistance to businesses severely impacted as a result of the 'Stay at Home, Work Safe' Order implemented by Medina County and the City of Hondo to reduce the spread and impact of COVID-19.

History:

On April 16, 2020, the City of Hondo City Council created the Small Business Task Force ("Task Force") to explore ways to assist small businesses affected by COVID-19. The Task Force will review all applications for Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program.

The Task Force consists of: Hondo City Mayor, James W. Danner, Sr., Hondo City Council Member John McAnelly; City Manager of the City of Hondo Kim Davis; Economic Development Corporation Board President Bobby Ainsley; Hondo Economic Development Corporation Executive Director Genevieve Flores; Hondo Area Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Heather Curtsinger; Hondo Independent School District Assistant Superintendent Rosemary Mares; Medina County Economic Development Director Stephanie Blanks; and City Attorney for the City of Hondo Frank Garza. Unlike the other members of the Task Force, Frank Garza reviews applications for legal compliance only

The Keeping God's Country Working Grant Program will provide \$300,000.00 in government-funded grants through a partnership with the City of Hondo and the Hondo Economic Development Corporation. Further, the City is seeking substantial additional funding from the private sector.

Review Process:

The Small Business Task Force will review all applications to ensure completeness and eligibility. Applicants will receive notification of their application status within 5-7 business days of receipt. **All applications must include a signed W-9 form and any supporting documentation.** Applicants employing between 1 – 4 employees are eligible for grants up to \$2,000.00, 5 – 10 employees are eligible for grants up to \$5,000.00. Applicants employing between 11 – 25 employees are eligible for grants up to \$10,000.00. If granted, payments will be made directly to the applicant to be utilized for eligible expenses. The Task Force will accept and award applications/grants until funds are depleted.

Eligibility and Qualifications:

To keep businesses running through a time of social distancing, the Task Force developed this stimulus program to assist small Hondo businesses that are independently owned and operated with between 1 – 25 employees. Eligible industries may include retail (storefront), food and beverage; personal care (barber shop, nail salons, spas, etc.), automobile maintenance, education training, health/wellness, art galleries and small manufacturing businesses. **National chains, financial institutions, RV parks, apartment complexes, home-based businesses, permanently closed businesses, and non-profit organizations are not eligible for the grant. Grants will not exceed \$10,000.**

Application Process:

1. Applicant submits application with copy of advertisement and screen shot of the target audience to Economic Development staff for review. Advertisements unbecoming of the City of Hondo will not be approved.
2. The City Manager or their designee will review the completed application and proposed advertising. The applicant will be notified within one week of submission if approved or denied.

Hotel Occupancy Tax Payment Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program

Overview:

The City of Hondo has developed a Hotel Occupancy Tax Payment Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program to assist hotels within the City of Hondo during the COVID-19 pandemic. The program provides limited financial assistance through the deferral and forgiveness of hotel occupancy tax payments to hotels severely impacted as a result of the 'Stay at Home, Work Safe' Order implemented by Medina County and the City of Hondo to lessen the impact of COVID-19.

History:

The Hondo City Council took measures at the April 16, 2020 City Council meeting to defer hotel occupancy tax payments for April 20, 2020 and May 20, 2020 for 60 days with an effort to support all hotels in good-standing with the City of Hondo Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund. The City Council required all hotels applying for deferral to submit a written employee retention plan to receive the 60-day deferral.

The Hotel Occupancy Tax Emergency Deferral + Forgiveness Program provides a 60-day deferral of hotel occupancy tax payments for April 20, 2020 and May 20, 2020, with an additional offering of forgiving up to \$1,000.00 per month for a total of no more than three (3) months of forgiven occupancy tax payments. This program has an aggregate of \$9,000.00 available for hotel occupancy tax forgiveness.

Review Process:

Deferral and forgiveness of hotel occupancy tax payments are not automatic; hotels must apply to be eligible. Applications will be accepted now through May 20, 2020 for review by the Eligibility Task Force Team to ensure completeness and eligibility. Applicants will be notified of the status of their application within 3-5 days of receipt. **All applications must include a signed W-9 form and any supporting documentation.**

- Separate applications must be submitted for the request of the April 20, 2020 tax payment and the May 20, 2020 tax payment. If an applicant wishes to request forgiveness of up to \$1,000 in deferred tax payments, they must do so in writing in the deferral application. They are eligible for three requests.
- Applicants are required to still fill out and submit the City of Hondo's Hotel Occupancy Tax Report to document the amount of tax being deferred.

Eligibility and Qualifications:

To keep hotels running through a time of social distancing, the City of Hondo has developed a deferral and forgiveness program that can assist hotels that **1) pay hotel occupancy tax to the City of Hondo and 2) are in good-standing on HOT payments.** Hotels wishing to apply for the program must meet the following criteria:

_____ Experienced or projected to experience a decline in revenue between March 1, 2020 and May 31, 2020 as a result of COVID-19 pandemic.

_____ In good standing with the City of Hondo with regard to licensing and finance, including being current on sales and use tax payments.

_____ Engaged in activities that are legal under city and state law.

_____ Meet program technical requirements including ability to provide financial records to support request.
